
The rapidly changing global landscape is causing significant anxiety in today's young adults, leaving them uncertain about their future prospects.

Our academic programs, dorm life, leadership opportunities and community are all designed to help young people explore and solidify their faith while preparing them for their future.



## YOUTH QUAKE

In the early 1960s, Henry Unrau had an idea that would change countless Canadian teenagers' lives. The event, then named the Midwest Youth Retreat, took place in November of 1963. Drawing an astonishing 500 attendees, it far exceeded expectations. The name "Youth Quake" emerged in 1972 from that year's earthquake theme.

In 2022, the Youth Quake team hosted YQatHome in February and organized in-person events for different age groups. Senior high students gathered at Briercrest from April 29th to May 1st, while junior high students met on May 6th and 7th. Unrau's original vision to empower and inspire Canadian youth was realized in all three events, which were highly successful and well-attended.



YQ is a two to three-day Christian youth retreat where young people across Western Canada come together to worship and learn about God. YQ events feature engaging speakers, interactive activities, informative workshops, live worship bands, and group discussions. Youth Quake attendees are encouraged to deepen their faith in Jesus Christ and build meaningful relationships with other Christian community members.



This year's YQ events theme was Psalm 23 and The Good Shepherd. Guest speakers unpacked the meaningful passage during the main events, while the workshops and small group sessions provided practical applications and discussions on how to apply the teaching in daily life. In between the learning sessions, students had time to have loads of fun! Activities included laser tag, gaining tournaments, wall climbing, and horseback riding.



Another wonderful highlight of YQ is the scholarship giveaways. This year, six scholarships (worth \$13,904) were rewarded on stage in a celebration with the whole crowd. During the Senior High Retreat weekend, 23 attendees submitted a scholarship form. Among them, nine were new applicants to Briercrest College. Six of the 23 received an on-stage scholarship. The other 17 will receive a \$500 award when they enroll, thanks to generous donors who enabled us to offer \$500 bursaries (total value of \$10,000) to anyone who applies

to Briercrest College or Christian Academy while at YO.

Each weekend also involved worship services and opportunities to draw closer to God. Attendees could respond to the message by committing to Jesus Christ or renewing previous commitments. AJ Crocker, VP of External Relations, later shared with the staff and faculty a special moment that happened as the junior YQ weekend was ending:





"As many of you were tearing down and starting to clean up, we saw dozens of kids raise their hands to receive Jesus as their Saviour for the first time. It was an incredible sight to see. Our speaker, Colin Lancelot, then allowed the others to consider rededicating their lives and commit to following the Good Shepherd with their whole life. Even more, hands went up. It was a calm, reflective moment with dozens and dozens of kids committing to follow our Lord at such a

key time in their lives."









This year's Youth Quake brought immense joy and excitement, leaving a lasting impact on attending youth.



This year Briercrest Christian Academy was excited to welcome 147 students to campus. Fifty-three of those are dorm students and 10 are international. We have welcomed students from China, Ethiopia, Bulgaria, Austria, Nigeria, and Hong Kong. In addition, students transferred in from seven provinces.

The fall welcomed a facility refresh in addition to a new staff member. The facilities staff worked hard painting and updating our space this past summer for which we are incredibly thankful. With great excitement, Crystal Gray joined us to focus on our Fine Arts Dept. Crystal brought together an all-star team to stage BCA's first musical in a decade and they did it with class. We are very proud of all that were involved.

In addition to our association with ACSI, the staff are embarking on a deep dive into the

work of "Flourishing Schools" and focusing on how we can live in the fullness of where God would desire us to be. This is providing a space for healthy conversations as we strive to move forward.

BCA's desire for greater family and community involvement has given us the opportunity to establish a School Community Council. Though we are in the infant stages of getting this off the ground we are excited for the direction it is going. Opening up our campus to the Provincial Association of Christian Schools International conference as well as the Historic Schools of Saskatchewan conference has allowed us to show off our space and all the opportunities our students have on campus.



This summer saw the TESOL program's first post-internship. A post-internship is an opportunity for students who completed their internship the previous summer to serve on one final

internship before they graduate. The Mexico post-internship team was hosted by an evangelical church in a town in Oaxaca. The church had realized that many of the people in their town had never (and perhaps might never) come inside their church, so they decided to offer English language classes in the church building taught by our interns. Around 60% of the people who came to the classes had never stepped foot inside the church before. Almost everyone who took part said they would take more classes if they were offered in 2024, something the Briercrest TESOL program is now planning as part of our exciting internship plans for the coming summer.



The pre-internship is an opportunity for students at the end of their first year of TESOL studies as well as students from other Briercrest programs to teach conversational English. This year's pre-internship team served in Germany teaching English for two hours per day at a Bible camp for German teenagers run by our program partner, Neues Leben (New Life). This was the tenth year we have sent a team to serve at the camp. Apart from the English classes, which included Bible memorization and daily, faith-based topics, the highlight was the evening chapels where the Word was preached and everyone worshipped together. Our team had the opportunity to talk with the teenagers afterwards and to pray with them. Almost half of the

teenagers attending the camp are unchurched and register simply to improve their conversational English. For this reason, it is significant that they also hear the gospel for the first time.

The main internship is a required part of the Briercrest TESOL program and students do this at the end of their second year of study. Our three internship teams served in Cambodia, Thailand, and Mexico. The Cambodia internship was in partnership with a ministry in Phnom Penh called Amazing Grace Association (AGA), an organization the Briercrest TESOL program has been partnering with since we sent our first team back in 2016. This year's team taught English to over 100 English major students at AGA Institute, a private higher education college run by AGA, while another member of the team taught kindergarten to grade 5 students at AGA's elementary school.

The students teaching at the Institute had opportunities outside of class to share the message of Christ with English learners who were mostly nominally Buddhist, and the team often found themselves addressing fears of spiritual darkness. They also encouraged the Christian students who attended the young adults group meeting in AGA's church by sharing their testimonies and talking about their journey with Christ. The contact with the elementary school was also about sharing the gospel with the Cambodian teachers, many of whom are not yet believers, as well as encouraging those who already are.

The Thailand internship was in a university city and ran as part of our first collaboration with Overseas Missionary Fellowship (OMF).



OMF has an outreach centre near one of the university campuses but had never been given the opportunity to work inside the university before this summer. So the fact that our team was invited by the university to teach English classes was of great strategic importance. The team members were also able to connect with the students who came to spend time at the outreach centre, sharing the gospel over meals and games.

The Mexico intern was a mature student who already had a lot of experience in Mexico, having served as a missionary there for a number of years together with her family. The internship provided her with opportunities to teach at a pedagogical university and a private language school while reconnecting with the people she used to know in northwestern Mexico. She was able to also test out opportunities for future ministry once she graduates.



This year we received a significant increase in Seminary applications. Notably, we processed a surge in international students choosing Briercrest as their spiritual and academic home.

This growth is a testament to the dedication of our staff and faculty, your continued support, and God's blessing, which have been pivotal in shaping our institution into a beacon of theological excellence and spiritual transformation. We are profoundly grateful for your investment in our mission.

Last year was Nigel Mullan's 19th as head coach of Briercrest Men's Volleyball. Even though league rules only permit the team to dress 14 players for games, he assembled a roster of 24. From an outside perspective, it might seem like a hard sell to recruit athletes when they have a 40% chance of sitting out any given match. Moreover, his program does not receive additional funding, so he cannot award competitive scholarships to many of his players. But there is something undeniably special about Mullan's coaching and leadership, cultivating a strong family atmosphere in which he, his staff, and older players can invest in future starters. To accomplish this, he and his wife, Natalie, find creative ways to reduce travel costs, such as preparing and packing meals for road games. "We do sacrifice, but we see that as an opportunity to have more people involved with Briercrest because we think that Briercrest is a huge component in changing a life's trajectory," he says.

As much as Mullan believes that every game is an opportunity to be an ambassador for Christ, Briercrest was delighted to cheer on



Men's Volleyball as they clinched their second league championship under Mullan's tenure. Reflecting on the experience, Mullan says, "Heading into the ACAC championship, I spent some time with the team beforehand to remind them that how we prepare matters, not for the medal but the fact that we're chasing a platform to have an impact for the Lord."

Mullan's team would take their witness to the big stage at CCAA Men's Volleyball Nationals. En route to earning their first national medal (bronze), Briercrest had to face Providence University College. "That was unique because their coach is an alumnus and used to play for me. There are all types of emotions to navigate that space and be competitive, but still there's love between us," says Mullan.



After defeating Providence, Mullan felt led to pray with them. "As we huddled, you could just hear the cameras going off taking pictures. For those that know, I'm not a very public person, but the fact that we were on a platform getting to witness to a national audience was pretty cool."



We are thrilled to share that we hosted over 700 youth at our 2023 Briercrest Summer Sports Camps.

- hosting ACAC home playoff games for four different sports in one season






